Household Tips for the Fall Season

This time of year is actually a great time to tackle some important tasks around the house. The following are some ideas to help get you started:

1. Replace your furnace filter and get it inspected/serviced.
2. Shutdown and blowout your underground sprinkler systems.
3. Aerate your lawn.
4. Apply a lawn "winterizer" fertilizer.
5. Clean out your gutters after the last leaves have fallen.
6. Check the caulking around windows and doors to prevent heat loss.
7. Plant your bulbs now so you can enjoy them in the spring.
8. Drain the gas in your lawnmower and bring out the snowblower!
9. Add more insulation for your attic.
10. Fertilize and water your trees and shrubs.

Our Neighborhood Watch program works through the use of an e-mail communication tree. Important information from the Aurora Police Department regarding our neighborhood is forwarded to each participating resident in a timely manner. Each area has a block captain that is responsible for his/her area of residents. Currently we have over 25 block captains and over 300 participating households. Our neighborhood contains roughly 500 households, so that means there are nearly 200 households not yet participating. Joining only takes a moment and helps you stay informed!

MINUTES OF THE MEETING (AUGUST 10, 2009)

Ethiopian Youth Center, 2171 S. Chambers Road, Aurora, CO 80014

Call to Order:

Bill Hallinan, President, called the meeting to order at 7:06pm.

Minutes:

The minutes of the May 4, 2009 meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter.

Treasurer's Report:

The bank balance as of the last meeting on May 4, 2009 was \$1,494.36. On May 11, 2009, there was a deposit of \$160.00 for advertising sales. On July 24, 2009, there was a check written for the newsletter printing expense of \$123.77. On August 2, 2009, there was a check written for newsletter distribution supplies. The ending balance as of August 3, 2009 was \$1,518.82.

New Business:

We discussed how donations have been down a bit this year, and we are now working to contact some of the nearby neighborhood businesses to see if they are interested in advertising in our newsletter. The cost to purchase an ad are currently \$10.00 per quarter for a business card size, \$25.00 per quarter for a ¼ page, \$45.00 per quarter for a half page, and \$75.00 per quarter for a full page (one-sided).

Bill is planning to attend the neighbor to neighbor round table meeting at the City of Aurora. The environmental supervisor will be discussing sustainable practices. Bill is also planning to attend Molly Markert's Ward IV meeting.

A reminder that the next neighborhood cleanup day is Saturday, October 10th from 10am – noon. On the previous neighborhood cleanup day, only 4 people attended. We would like to remind everyone to please plan on attending to help keep our neighborhood looking good.

Lynn Bradley paid \$260.00 of her own money for the Neighborhood Watch event this last spring. We have all agreed to pay Lynn \$100.00 from the Woodrim Crossings Neighborhood Association fund to reward her for her efforts, and to help offset her personal costs.

We are changing the new meeting date from the first Monday of every quarter to the second Tuesday of every quarter. As a result, the next neighborhood association meeting will be held on November, 10th.

Sharon Ward attended the District 3 National Night Out at Tierra Park August 8, 2009. Approximately 80 neighbors attended. The police and firemen interacted with all age groups. The dog from the K-9 unit and his "master", the Police Recruiting car – a Dodge Charger with American Flag style paint, fire trucks, police cars and motorcycles were all big attractions. A representative from Target handed out yummy sugar cookies, pencils, and beach balls. We did not receive any correspondence during this quarter.

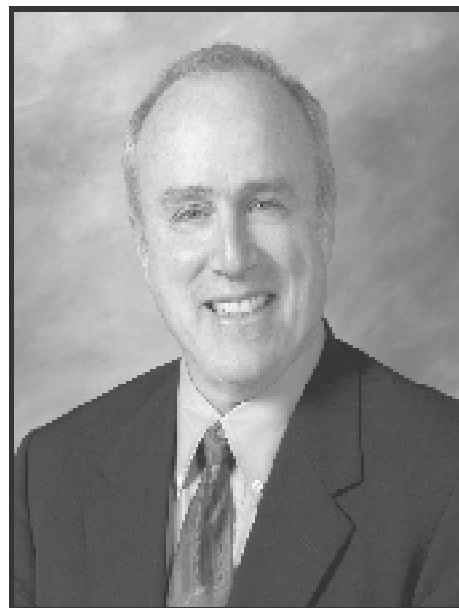

Code Corner - Snow Removal

Within 24 hours after a snowfall ends, snow must be removed from all city sidewalks adjacent to your property, including snow on sidewalks outside rear and side fences. Administrative charges will be imposed for failure to comply and a Summons may be issued.

Code Corner - Animals

Only customary household pets are allowed. A maximum of three adult dogs and five cats may be kept at any one location. All cats and dogs must have yearly rabies vaccinations and be licensed within the City. It is the responsibility of the occupants and/or owner to remove all animal droppings from their property on a daily basis. Animal owners/custodians are responsible for the immediate removal of all excrement deposited by the animal upon any Public Property. Dogs found running at large may be impounded by the Animal Care Division, 303-326-8280.

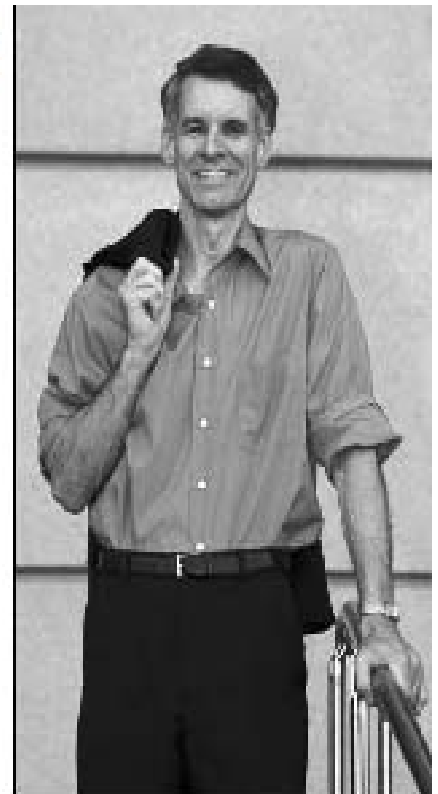
